Dear Vice-President,

We are honored to address you on behalf of the organizations "International Coalition for Venezuela, united in one voice", "The Patriotic Junta of Venezuela", "Venezuela Freedom" and "Moveré", to emphasize that the United States is a signatory of the Inter-American Treaty of Reciprocal Assistance (TIAR), signed on September 2, 1947, as well as the Protocol of Reforms, of July 26, 1975, which recommended and approved the celebration of the treaty aimed at preventing and suppressing threats and acts of aggression against any of the countries of America.

We consider that the current situation in Venezuela meet the characteristics for the US President Trump, TIAR member, invokes the application of the aforementioned Treaty, since a group of transnational organized crime kidnapped Venezuela twenty years ago, with the arrival to the power of Lieutenant Colonel Hugo Chávez, deepening with the imposition of the Cuban tyranny of Nicolás Maduro as president in charge, violating the Bolivarian Constitution. From Cuba, an intervention has been carried out through an axis with Russia, Iran, Hezbollah, FARC of Colombia and drug trafficking controlling today most of the institutions, the security of ports and airports, food distribution, national police and the FANB, depredating our oil industry, our mineral wealth and our human capital, generating the mass exodus and the greatest humanitarian crisis in our history.

We believe it is essential that the TIAR Advisory Body and the sixteen Member States be summoned urgently. We also consider that Dr. Luis Almagro as Secretary General of the OAS should be the great convenor of the Permanent Council of the OAS, so that the Protocol of Reform of the Inter-American Treaty of Reciprocal Assistance can be applied.

We also urgently require the military intervention of an international alliance in order to execute the judgment of the Supreme Court of Justice, which ordered the capture of Nicolás Maduro and all his accomplices for corruption offenses in the ODEBRECHT case, based on the Convention of the United Nations against Transnational Organized Crime and its Protocols signed in Palermo, Italy in December 2000.

Mr. Vice President, when we request this support, we are reminded of the interview in 1805 between Generalissimo Francisco de Miranda and President Thomas Jefferson and months

later in 1806 Miranda departed from the Port of New York in The Leander's Ship with 200 soldiers from several nations to free Venezuela from the Spanish empire.

Today, Venezuela is a concentration camp and, from now until December, there is no doubt that the number of children and women crossing the borders will increase, fleeing tyranny. They commit genocide with absolute impunity.

There have been many diplomatic measures or sanctions to freeze the financial accounts to generals and ministers to stop this narco-regime but they have not been enough.

The foregoing has violated the sovereignty, freedom and independence of Venezuela, constituting an aggression that endangers the peace of America.

In light of the foregoing, we urgently request that the TIAR be applied for the freedom and independence of the Venezuelan people.
